



## **PARTY IN THE PADDOCK – WHITE HILLS UNDER AGE PATRON CONSENT FORM 2019**

Party in the Paddock Music Festival in White Hills is an all ages event. Children and Ticket Holders under 18 years of age must be accompanied by a ticket holding parent, adult legal guardian or adult eligible carer AT ALL TIMES. People other than a parent or legal guardian can be an eligible carer IF:

- The guardian is the ticket holders sibling and is 18+  
or
- The guardian is not the sibling but is over 21 years of age
- The minor both enters the festival and remains with the guardian throughout the festival.
- The minor brings written consent from their parent or legal guardian.
- The guardian must not be responsible for any more than TWO underage patrons
- If your guardian is a step sibling or half sibling, you will also have to bring a signed letter from a parent stating that you are related.

Anyone who is considering being the nominated eligible carer should undertake this responsibility very carefully. U18 patrons must not engage in any illegal or disruptive activities whilst on site including underage drinking, use of illicit substances or any generally disruptive behaviour. Any breach of these conditions may result in the eviction of the eligible carer and all accompanying minors from the festival site.

If you are U18 and plan to attend the PITP festival with an adult that is not your parent or legal guardian, your parent or legal guardian must provide their consent using this form. This form must be signed by the minor's parent or legal guardian AND the eligible over 18 carer, in the presence of an authorised witness. This can be done on separate occasions. Examples of authorised witnesses are listed on the following page. The form MUST be completed before getting to the festival. You must enter the event with your nominated guardian and present this completed form when you exchange your ticket for a wristband at wristbanding booths on site.

Any person described on the Australian Government's Statutory Declaration Signatory List can serve as the Authorised Witness for this Under Age Patron Consent Form. A statutory declaration under the Statutory Declarations Act 1959 may be made before:

(1) a person who is currently licensed or registered under a law to practise in one of the following occupations:
